

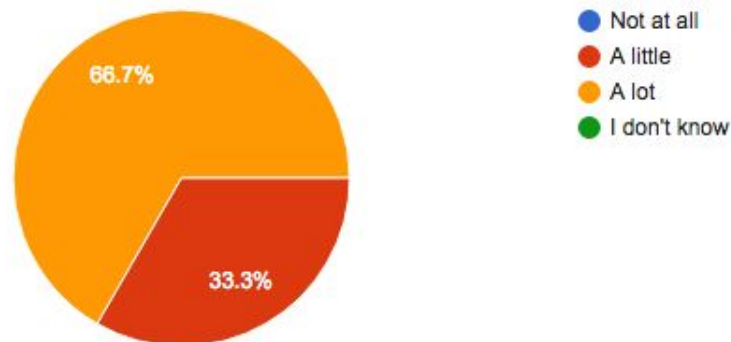

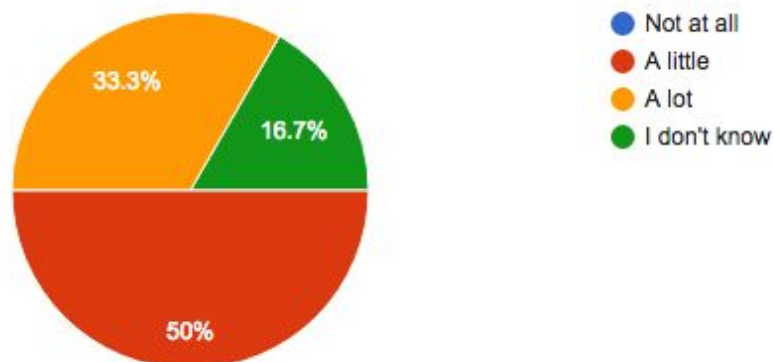
In your opinion, did this event create awareness of mental health issues?

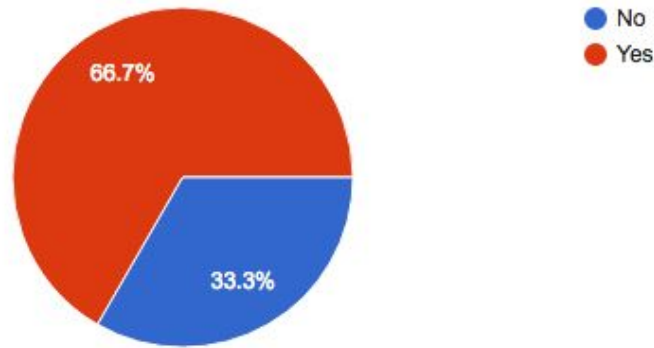


In your opinion, did this event reduce stigma related to mental illness?

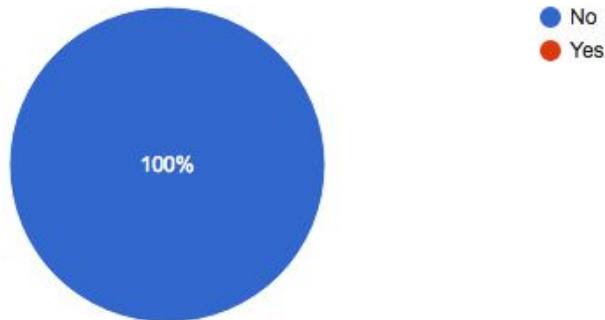

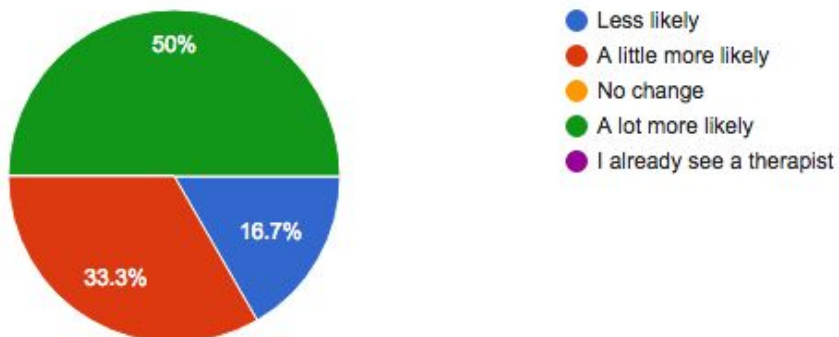
Did you know about your school's counseling services before this event?

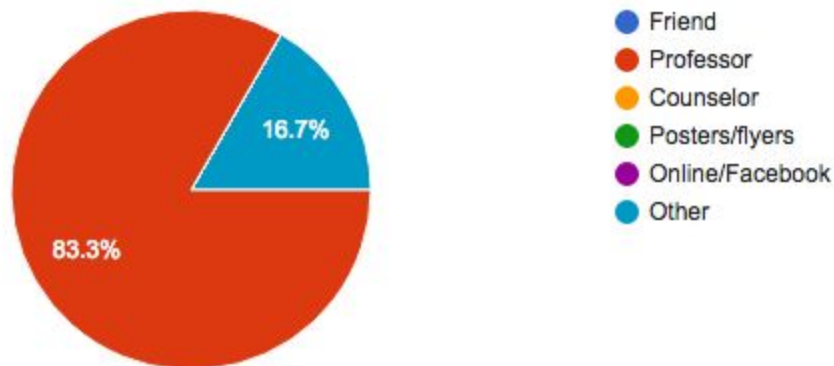
After this event, are you more or less likely to seek support for your mental health?

- To respect and listen to each other

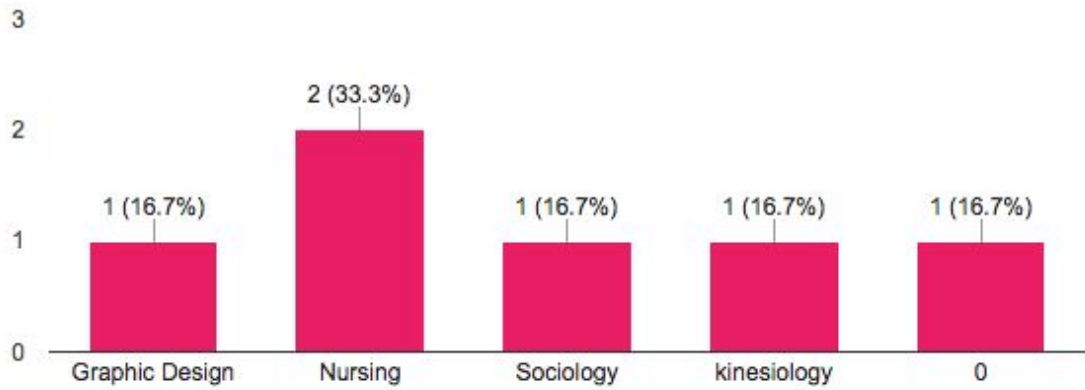
How would you describe this event to a friend?

- It was a very interesting, useful event. Thank you a lot

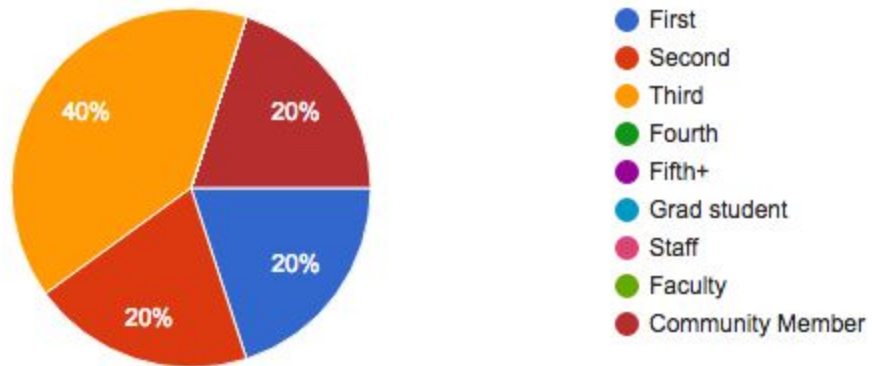
How can we improve this event in the future?

- Everything went great

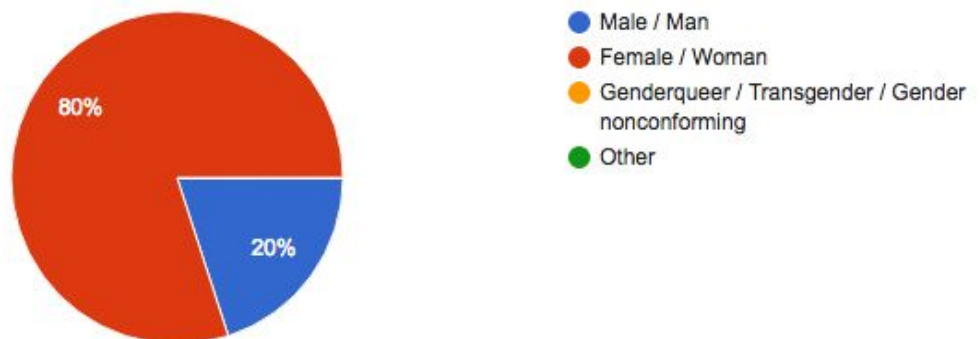
Major? (6 responses)
